

HAVE MORE THAN ONE SEARCH ENGINE AT YOUR FINGERTIPS

For obvious reasons, Microsoft's Bing is the default (automatic) search engine that is associated with Edge (and Internet Explorer). But many users may prefer a different provider for their Search Engine. Google, anyone?

To branch out beyond Bing without needing to browse all the way to your chosen search provider's Web page:

1. Open Edge.
2. Click on the 3-dots located at the upper right corner of the homepage.
3. Click on Settings.
4. Click on View Advanced Settings (it's located down the column)
5. Find *Search in the address bar with Bing*.
6. Click on Change to find other search engines that will be listed (discovered).
7. To add others, from the Edge browser, enter the search engine's website and open that page.
8. Select More actions (...) > Settings and then scroll down to select View advanced settings. In the list under Search in the address bar with, select Change.
9. Select your search engine's website and then select Set as default. If you don't select the search engine, the Set as default button will be grayed out.
